Choose 3 different coloured tasks each Friday. Post your learning to SeeSaw.

Play Sumdog for 20 minutes.	Plan a trip to a zoo or safari park in Scotland with your family. You will have a budget of £150. Plan out how much it will cost to get there and back, get into the zoo or park and to eat for the day. Will you have enough money?	Using fruit and vegetables you have at home make a prediction chart of which ones you think will sink or float. Test it to see if your hypothesis is right. Record your results.	Visit Hour of Code and try to code a game or activity.
Find out about an animal that lives in our local environment. What kind of habitat does it have? What does it need to survive? Where does it get its food sources?	Create a survey about your friends and families favourite sweet. Try to get results from about 10 people. Then create a graph with the information on excel.	Read a book or e-book. Create a book review about what you have read.	Collect random objects from around the house and put them into a bag. Peek into the bag and describe one of the objects with as many adjectives as you can. See if someone can guess the object?
Create a word cloud about someone or something you care about. Use as many wow words as possible.	Make a collage using only recyclable items. How creative can you be?	Make a range of greetings cards to be kept for special occasions. e.g. birthdays, good luck cards, congratulations, thank cards.	Make up a dance routine to a song you like. Can you teach the routine to someone else? Post a video of your dance.
Practise your ball skills. Can you dribble a ball around cones (or whatever objects you have) with both your hands and feet.	Make a healthy meal with a family member. Think about what the ingredients provide for your body. Take a picture of your meal and write out the recipe.	Think about what makes a good friend. Write a recipe with ingredients and a method to make a good friend.	Look into the history of our school. Gather some facts such as when it was first build, did it always look like it does now, who built it etc.
Find out about a country or city far away. Compare it to where you live.	Draw a map of your house. Can you mark where all the electrical devices are in your house. E.g. all sockets, lamps, TV's etc.	Can you design a product that you think would benefit home learning. Think about what the benefits of it will be, how it will be made and how much it would cost to make.	Create a movie / video pretending you are a news reporter. Tell us about a real-life news story from your point of view.
Create a PowerPoint presentation all about family. Use transitions and animations to make it look professional.	Create a family board game that everyone can enjoy. You will need to plan it first, ensuring you think about the aim of the game, the parts you will need, how many players can play and how you can win the game. Think about what makes the game fair and how you can show fairness when playing.	Research an upcoming religious festival. Create a poster or fact file about this. Try to include as many facts as possible remember to write down sources of where you found your facts and information.	Choose two different religions and find 5 things that they do which are similar and 5 things which are different.
